

Destinations of Emanuel School Upper Sixth Leavers: 3 year summary report

October 2014 – October 2016 entry

Oxford and Cambridge

In the last 3 years 13 students have left Emanuel to go either Oxford or Cambridge (bringing the total to 23 Emanuel students going to Oxford or Cambridge since October 2012, including the October 2017 entry).

Historically Oxford has been the more favoured destination over that period, although for 2017 entry the favoured choice has been Cambridge, with 5 offers compared to 1 offer from Oxford.

October 2014: Engineering at Oriel College, Oxford; English at New College, Oxford; Classical Archaeology and Ancient History at Balliol, Oxford; Psychology at St Anne's College, Oxford; History at Peterhouse, Cambridge

October 2015: English at Corpus Christi College, Oxford; English and Spanish at St. Hugh's, Oxford; Human Social and Political Sciences at St Catherine's College, Cambridge

October 2016: English at New College, Oxford; English at St Edmund's Hall, Oxford; Classics at Worcester College, Oxford; History at University College, Oxford; Music at Trinity College, Cambridge

(October 2017, subject to meeting their offers: Classics at St Anne's, Oxford; Engineering at Robinson College, Cambridge; History at Robinson College; Cambridge; Japanese Studies at Emmanuel College, Cambridge; Archaeology at Selwyn College; Cambridge; Classics at St John's College, Cambridge)

Those who have chosen to stay in London for the past 3 years have gone to UCL, KCL, Imperial, SOAS, Royal Holloway, Goldsmiths and Queen Mary.

Applications Abroad

2014: 3 students went to study abroad. One went to Curtin University in Perth, Australia, one went to the University of Miami in the USA and one went to study at Queen's Belfast in Ireland.

2015: 1 went to Brandeis University in the USA

2016: 1 went to Wake Forest in the USA.

Note that for 2017 entry 3 students are holding offers in the USA: UNC Chapel Hill; University of Minnesota (on a 100% Girls' Rowing scholarship) and Emerson College, Boston. One student has an offer from McGill University in Canada.

Very popular courses include: Economics (Durham-4, Essex, Warwick-2, Kent, and Leicester)

14 students have chosen Business related courses such as: Business and Management, International Business, Business Management and Marketing, Business and Business Management with e-Business.

Popular destinations for English Literature students have included; Oxford (4 and also 1 for English and Spanish), King's College London, Glasgow (English Literature and History), UEA (English Literature and Drama-3), Edinburgh (Art History and English Literature), Sheffield, Warwick (English and Theatre Studies), Leeds, Sussex (English and Film Studies).

Modern Languages courses students have favoured Edinburgh (Spanish and English Literature), Exeter (Modern Languages), Leeds (French and Spanish), Bath (Modern Languages and European Studies-2) Southampton (Modern Languages), Birmingham (Modern Languages and Music), International Relations and Spanish (Leeds), Chemistry with French for Science (Imperial), European and International Studies [Italian] (Royal Holloway)
