## Articulation Award 2018



The Art Department is pleased to announce that Marla has been selected to go through to the semi-finals of the prestigious ARTiculation award, a national public speaking competition run by the Roche Court Educational Trust and the University of Cambridge. The competition gives students the opportunity to present an original talk about an artwork of their choice. Last Tuesday, Marla gave an outstanding talk about the installation *A Subtlety*, by Kara Walker at the regional heat held at Leighton House Gallery in London. Dr Antonia Bostrom, acting director of collections and research and keeper of sculpture, metalwork, ceramics and glass at the V&A Museum, and judge for the competition, was impressed by Marla's inspiring talk which focused on issues of race and gender within the work of art. Marla competed against candidates from several leading London schools, winning a place in the semi-finals at the National Gallery on 2 March. We hope that the next round of the competition is a success for Marla and that she has the opportunity to present her talk at the final at Clare College, Cambridge on 9 March.

## Talking art with OE Hattie Godfrey



On Monday (22 January) OE Hattie Godfrey visited Emanuel to talk to our sixth form art students. Hattie left Emanuel in 2013 and went to Central St Martins for Art Foundation and from there to Goldsmiths, University of London, to study Fine Art where she is currently in her third year. She told us about how she moved from drawing, embroidery and installation, with a feminist focus, while she was at Emanuel to her current practice working mainly in performance art and the written word. She collaborates with other artists and can often be found at the New Shoreditch Theatre where she is head of curation as well as studying at Goldsmiths. Her very informative talk gave our students insight into life at art school and beyond, which was particularly useful as we have 10 upper six students currently applying to art foundation courses for next academic year. The Emanuel boys swimming team participated in their first competitive gala of the academic year. It was a close contest with an initial score showing Latymer Upper as the victors, but an overnight recount revealed that Emanuel were the winners. The final results were:

- First - Emanuel- 96 points.
- Second - Latymer Upper- 95 points.
- Third - Wimbledon College- 89 points.
- Fourth - Ibstock Place- 57 points.

Our U15 team did extremely well, streaking ahead of all the competition on 30 points, with Latymer in second on 28 points. The U14 team also did well managing to come

first by a single point, mirroring the one-point victory of the overall results. Both the U12 and U13 teams came third in their year groups competition.

During the fiercely competitive afternoon an incredible 18 Emanuel Swimming records were broken. Rowan had an impressive swim, clocking in at 41.16 for the U15 50-meter breaststroke. Edgar swam the U12 25-meter breaststroke/backstroke in 18.76 seconds. The U14 50-meter backstroke also saw an impressive 37.29 from Nico. Adrian flew in at 15.47 in the U14 25-meter butterfly and raced through the U14 100-meter individual medley in 1.23.40. Two records were broken in the medley relay and two in the freestyle relay. Our first place finish is an encouraging start to the season and we are looking forward to the next galas on 28 February and 7 March where we hope of continuing on our winning streak.
