4. PGL Overseas Adventure Trip, France: 26th July - 2nd August 2020

The PE Department are offering students who are currently in years 7 to 12 the opportunity of a PGL Overseas Adventure trip to Mimosa, South France during the summer holidays 2020. The trip will consist of approximately 40 students, accompanied by 5 staff members, all of whom have had years of experience in running overseas educational visits.

The cost per student is £610.00, payable in instalments and includes:

- Return coach/ferry travel from school
- A daily programme of watersports and adventure activities
- Fully supervised evening entertainment programme and events
- Full board, to include meals and accommodation
- Fully comprehensive travel insurance

5. Information for students regarding livestock farming

We have been asked by a local farmer to share the following information about the safety of his livestock and students:

We have begun turning our young cattle out on the meadows around Flansham for their summer grazing. Many young students may be unaware of the risks and responsibilities around livestock farming, so please note the following:

Please avoid frightening the young animals if you come into contact with them. The animals will not hurt humans. Please do not chase them, let dogs run off the lead or throw sticks and stones at them.

Please do not jump on the wires on the boundary fences as this slackens them, or cut the fences as the stock may escape; the new A259 road now runs very close to the animals and we must ensure they do not get onto this busy road. We fence our meadows well just to avoid situations like this and we need all the cooperation we can get.
