Sixth Form Uniform

Over the years, since the first Sixth Form students designed the uniform code, the school has been complimented on students' academic success, extra curricular involvement and their smartness.

The following simple guidelines have evolved to encourage students to represent themselves, their families and the school in the best possible way, whilst also giving the students more choice.

Students should dress smartly for school as if they were working in a formal office situation. They should also recognise that they will be setting an example as senior students of the school.

SPECIFIC GUIDELINES:

BOYS:

Winter Uniform

Collar, tie, trousers (NO jeans, combats or trousers that look like denim) and smart shoes

(NO canvas shoes, plimsolls, Vans, Converse or similar)

Summer Uniform

Polo Shirt or collar and tie and trousers (NO shorts or t-shirts). The Head of Sixth Form will inform you when summer uniform comes in to place.



GIRLS:

Winter Uniform

Dress or skirt of appropriate length or tailored trousers (NO jeans or trousers that look like denim) with blouse (NO strapless tops) and plain jumper or cardigan and smart shoes (NO canvas shoes, plimsolls, Vans, Converse or similar).

Summer Uniform

As above

Please note that the follow items are not acceptable items of clothing for Sixth Form:

- Coats & outerwear should not be worn inside the school building
- Jeans
- Combat Trousers
- Shorts
- Hoodies or items of clothing with references which could be offensive
- T-Shirts
- Strapless Tops
- Trainers / Converse / Canvas Shoes / Vans / Plimsolls / Ugg style boots /Toms
- As with main school only one stud per ear
- Hair should be of a natural colour and a style which is inoffensive and suitable for a professional establishment

The school reserves the right to veto a student's choice of clothing for school and doubts as to the suitability should be discussed with your Form Tutor, House Leader or Head of Sixth Form.
