

Hazelwick Sixth Form Appearance & Dress Code

All Hazelwick sixth formers are expected to dress formally, as are all members of any professional community. This code is intended to clarify our expectations regarding appropriate sixth form appearance. It is deliberately detailed in order to prevent uncertainty and misunderstanding about what is acceptable.

Male

- formal black suit with smart (straight-cut) trousers.
- formal plain white shirt (short-sleeved or long-sleeved) – tucked in fully at all times and with the top button fastened
- sixth form tie – done up properly and worn at an appropriate length
- a plain black V-neck jumper or waistcoat may be worn (with the tie fully showing) in addition to the suit jacket
- hair should not be aggressively short (i.e. no shorter than a No. 2 cut) or untidily long
- the use of gel to sculpt or spike hair to create an unnatural appearance is not permitted
- any facial hair must be kept neat and tidy
- ear/nose/tongue jewellery is not permitted

Female

- formal black suit with either smart modest length black skirt (non-cling, no excessive slit) or smart trousers (straight-cut or bootleg, full length)
- plain white, buttoned shirt/blouse (short sleeved or long-sleeved) of a formal nature (i.e. no T-shirts, vests or polo shirts)
- a plain black V-neck jumper or waistcoat may be worn in addition to the suit jacket
- dresses of any sort are not permitted
- sheer fabrics and tops that expose shoulders or the navel are not permitted
- no excessive jewellery (i.e. earrings must be unobtrusive and no nose or tongue studs)
- very obvious nail varnish and obtrusive make-up are not to be worn

General

- shoes should be flat-heeled, plain black and formal
- no trainers, boots, high heels, flip-flops, plimsolls or sandals of any description
- no sweatshirts or large logos
- any hair colouring should be natural looking
- shaved patterns in the hair or eyebrows are not allowed
- outdoor coats should not be worn in class
- other jackets are not to be worn instead of the formal black suit jacket
- neither 'hoodies' nor denim jackets are to be worn at all

Students who are not dressed appropriately will either need to go home and change, or work independently in the Octagon.
