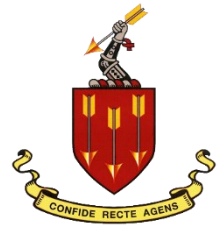

RECEPTION NEWS

We will start by feeding back some news from last week's Forest Fun. It was a very different session to normal... have your children told you about it? In the Traditional Tale, Little Red Riding Hood, the little girl goes to Grandma's house alone. She finds her way through the deep, dark forest and she doesn't get lost. The children were given the chance to do just that. The teachers walked the children over to the far-side of the Memorial park. The children played games and were encouraged to move round in an effort to disorientate them. They were then given the task of finding their own way back to school. The children were supervised closely at all times, but decision making about direction were left solely to them. Many disagreements took place but in true democratic style, the majority won and this proved to be very successful as the children navigated their way back to school really well. You have children with a good sense of direction...brilliant!



The Traditional Tale for this week has been The Three Billy Goat's Gruff.

The children had a surprise visit from a troll this week as part of traditional tales and Literacy. The shock of seeing a real live troll was thrilling. The children loved it! They were encouraged to use question words, Why? When? Where? What? to find out more about the troll from the story Billy Goats Gruff.

In Maths the children have been collecting and recording data. They have enjoyed hunting for characters from traditional tales and counting them, presenting the totals in the form of a Tally chart. They have taken votes on who their favourite characters are and recorded the information on Bar charts and they have even learnt to sort data into Venn diagrams. The lessons have been very practical and they have really enjoyed them.

In Forest Fun this week, we decided to stay on the school grounds and the children were set the task of rebuilding the bridge for the goats so they could cross the river. They were presented with lots of soft play equipment, (broken bridge) and they could see two river banks, (PE mats) and a river flowing through the middle, (blue material). Once again, they had to problem solve, work in teams, communicate and persevere until they had constructed a solution. It was interesting to see them at work and lots of fun was had!

Reception children really showed their maturity this week as they welcomed children from the current Nursery into their classrooms. The difference between the two age groups was quite obvious physically but moreover in action. Our Reception children have grown up and developed in so many ways and they were helpful, encouraging and supportive of their younger peers. What a journey they have made over the last year.

Reminders: Next Friday 25th May is the last day of this half term. The children can enjoy a well-deserved week of rest. We look forward to welcoming them back for their last half term in Reception on Monday 4th June.

Sun hats are needed every day please as the weather is so unpredictable and the children do play on the field at lunchtimes when it is sunny.

Please apply an all-day sun cream before sending the children in to school and then send in a sun cream that they can re-apply during the day.

Please ensure the children have a named water bottle. We remind the children to drink regularly throughout the day and we will provide tap water in a beaker, but if they have their own bottle, it is easier for them to access water when they want it. Thanks so much.
