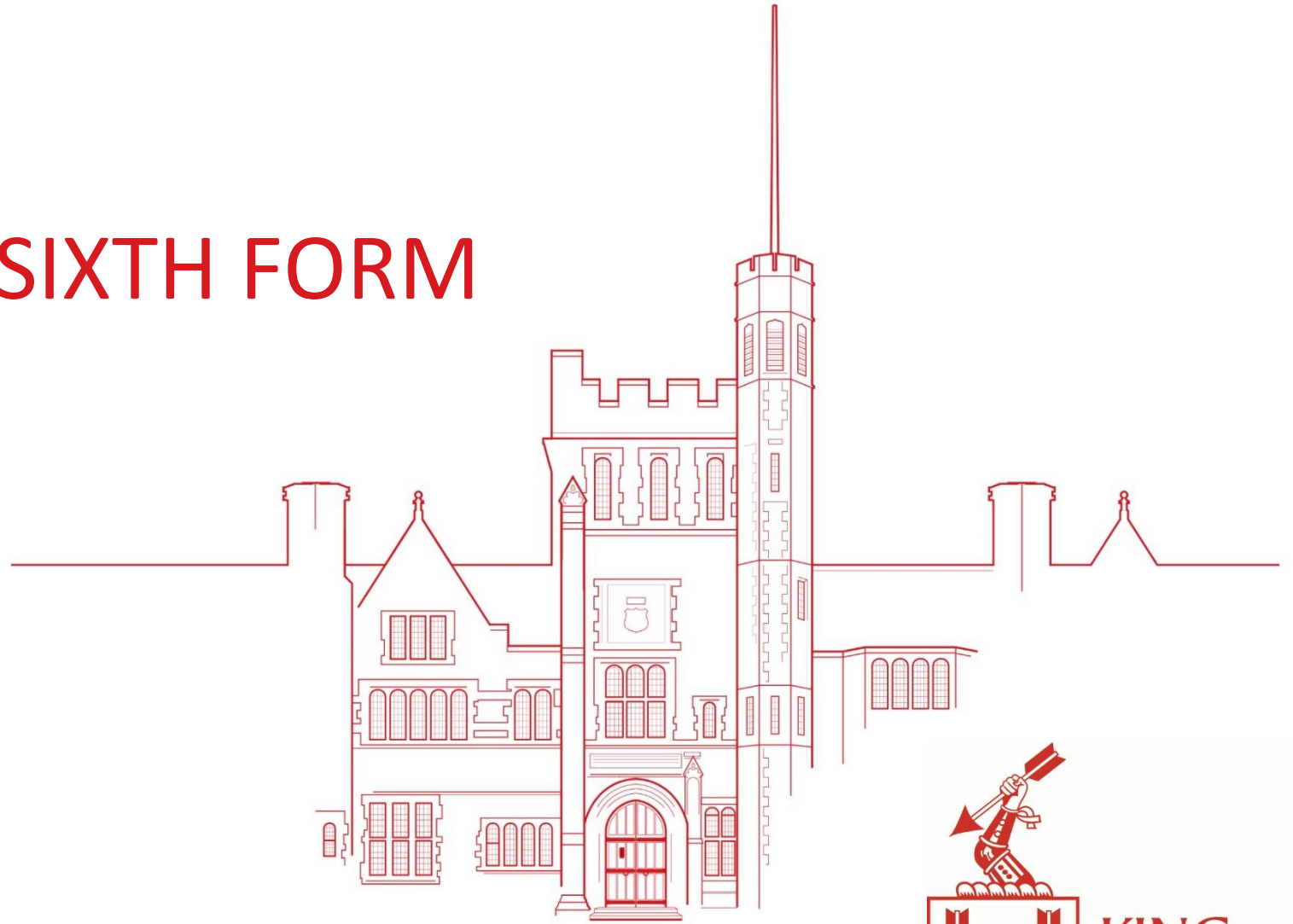

Dear Students and Parents

This is basically the same booklet as you received at the start of Year 12- as the aim was to cover all the examinations that you will come across during the next two years. This curriculum booklet has been put together as part of the Home-School partnership. As the courses at A level get specialised it only contains information of the examination board, specification number and modules studied. The website addresses are given for the examination board where detailed information can be found. Please take care to ensure you use the current qualifications. As you are aware there are lots of changes. The numbers given in each subject should ensure that you get the correct one. The AS courses are for teaching in September 2017 and Assessment in 2018. In this booklet you get the information for both Year 12 and Year 13. There is a hybrid system at the moment with Phase 1 subjects being a 2 year course to A level and the others still on the modular system. A reminder on which subjects are which is below.

Phase 1 & 2 subjects- (Art, Biology, Business, Chemistry, Computer Science, Economics, English Language, English Literature, French, German, Latin, Music, History, PE, Physics, Psychology RS, Spanish, Drama and Theatre Studies) These subjects have their entire final grade will be on the Year 13 exams/coursework.

Phase 3 subjects (Classical Civilisation, DT-Product Design and Food Technology, Geography, ICT, Law, Maths and Further Maths) will have modules in the bank from Year 12 which count 50% towards their A Level grade in Year 13.

In addition to A level subjects students have the option to start on the Extended Project Qualification and do an Interest Option lesson period 6 on a Friday which enables them to 'chill' a little before the weekend.

A levels are a tough course for students and they need to get on board with each course rapidly. As a guide they should be doing 4-5 hours a week per subject outside of lessons. We have 2 key assessment points in the sixth form to aid the students to prepare for major examinations which take place in June. These are reported to you via a grade card. The overview of key assessments looks like this.

November –within lessons Year 13 w/b Nov 6- with a Parents' Evening following on Thursday 16th November

February 26th – March 2nd mocks off timetable- both Y12 and Y13 together. A report will be sent home just before Easter. (provisional, this may start before half term to fit all the subjects and exams in).

June- External Examinations for all A level subjects. Non Phase 1&2 AS resit exams may be in May

Several subjects have a coursework element within A level assessment- but please be aware that all will have deadlines around Easter. This is just the nature of the courses. Most departments set intermediate deadlines to help the students organise their time it is very important for students to stick to these. In addition in all the science subjects students have to show practical competence. This requires the completion of at least 12 set practicals and the necessary write up – usually in a log book.

I hope that you will find the booklet informative and useful.

UCAS Applications

Most students will be applying to British Universities through UCAS. Key deadlines for the student's forms to be done are the following

- **Medics/Vets/Dentists/Oxbridge- Monday 25th September**
- **All other subjects-First draft- Thursday October 19th 12 noon** (be aware that staying after 4 pm to get this done is a real possibility for anyone failing to meet this)
- **FINAL applications Friday 24th November.**

This year sees a change in the UCAS points awarding scale- the relevant points are shown in the table that follows- some universities will offer a points offer rather than a grade offer. So for example they may ask for 112 points- This could be BBC at A level (40 + 40 + 32) or BB at A level (40 + 40) C at AS (12) and B in an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) giving the final 20 points needed.

Sixth Form coursework. 11 subjects have a non-exam element that contributes to the final grade. The nature of the A Level courses is that deadlines are all likely to be just before Easter. Keep up to date- departments set intermediate deadlines for a purpose. The internal marking of non-exam assessments is carried out in accordance with the procedures laid down by the examination boards. Students may ask for a review of marking. This should usually be done in writing within 2 working days of them being informed of the mark. A copy of the procedure can be obtained on application to Miss Ann Weitzel (Deputy Head).
