

ACADEMIC RESULTS 2014-2015

In the absence of any national scheme which offers comparative data to assess progress KHPS has continued to use the old national curriculum levels until a replacement scheme can be found which enables us to track progress as well as attainment. As state school are no longer using national curriculum levels all our data are compared to state school data from 2013. 2B was the 'expected' level for children at the end of Year 2 so all our data relate to pupils achieving level 2A or higher. 4B was the 'expected' level for the end of Year 6.

This year's results show:

89% were level 5 or above in reading; 91% last year (44% national)
75% were level 5 or above in writing; 73% last year (30% national)
80% were level 5 or above in maths; 86% last year (41% national)
86% were level 5 or above in science; 74% last year (36% national)

Level 6 maths has increased from 28% to 42% this year.

This year the more able writers did the SPAG test (Spelling, punctuation and grammar) which involved a more advanced writing task in which the different elements were assessed, rather than a straightforward writing task as in previous years.
