Jewellery Health and Safety Policy 2012

The overall rule is that jewellery should not be worn by either boys or girls. However, we realise that there may be two exceptions. Firstly, jewellery worn for religious purposes. Secondly, stud earrings.

For Health and Safety reasons the following School Policy will take effect from September 2012.

Nursery to Year 3

- Stud earrings cannot be worn on days when there are swimming, games or PE lessons.
- Jewellery worn for religious purposes must be removed for swimming, games or PE, for health and safety purposes.

Year 4 to Year 6

- Stud earrings cannot be worn on days when there are swimming, games or PE lessons, unless children are able to remove the earrings themselves.
- Jewellery worn for religious purposes must be removed for swimming, games or PE. If the item is too small to remove, it must be taped over. Parents will need to provide their children with the tape for this purpose.

A form must be completed by a parent who wishes their child to wear any item of jewellery. This form should be sent to the Headmaster. Any child who wears an item of jewellery to school does so at the risk of their parents. The school cannot be responsible for any loss or damage to this item. The permission form is available at both sites from the school offices.
