


2018 A LEVEL RESULTS

King's Rochester has a strong reputation for maximising the potential of pupils and this year was no exception as students achieved excellent A Level results. 11% of all grades were at A* and 25% were at A*/A with more than half of all grades being at A*-B. The top 40% of the year (comparable to a grammar school cohort), achieved 49% of their grades at A* / A with 84% A*-B. The overall average UCAS points were equivalent to three B grades per student.

2018 GCSE RESULTS

Pupils achieved outstanding GCSE results, made especially pleasing in light of the move towards more rigorous courses and a new grading system. A record 26% of all grades were at A* /9-8, a figure which has doubled since 2012. With 46% of grades at A*-A / 9-7 (only 2% behind last year's record haul), and with over 40% getting at least half at A*/A /9-7 it is no surprise that many pupils have been rewarded with excellent grades.

Under the new grading system a 7 is equivalent to an A grade with an 8 being the threshold for an A and a very limited number of top scores being given a 9. A 6 is equivalent to a B grade and the C grade is spread between 4 and 5.*
