Introduction:

The geography curriculum is a spiral curriculum in which the boys will revisit topics and build on their knowledge and understanding of various geographical topics.

Key Objectives:

- Revision of factors affecting Britain's climate
- Understanding the three different types of rainfall
- Understanding the causes and effects of Superstorm Sandy (2012)
- Studying the weather at The Mall (fieldwork assignment)
- Understanding why the environment needs protecting and how this can be done
- Understanding the indicators of development in a country
- Understanding what is meant by the term "sustainable development"
- Case studies: Peak District National Park and Tsavo National Park (Kenya)
- Revision of Year 6 work
