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Preparatory Uniform Checklist

Pre-Nursery

All the girls in Pre-Nursery wear home clothes.

Nursery to Year 2

Winter Uniform

- Marist Prep Winter Hat (French Navy)
- Marist Prep Pinafore
- Marist Prep Coat (Navy)
- Marist Prep Pullover – royal blue with crest
- Gold blouse with revere collar – long sleeve or short sleeve
- Socks – navy knee length or navy tights (any)
- Shoes – black/navy (any)
- Scarf

Summer Uniform

- Marist Prep Summer boater
- Marist Prep Summer dress
- Marist Prep French Navy Cardigan or Marist Prep Pullover
- Marist Prep Blazer – royal blue with crest
- Socks – white ankle/knee length (any)
- Black or Navy Shoes. Sandals may also be worn (not open toe) – dark blue (any)

All the above are available from Billings & Edmonds unless stated as 'any'

N.B - Shoe Guidelines

Please see separate flyer for 'Clarks' and 'Start Rite' recommended shoe designs. The styles are intended to provide an example of the type of school shoe recommended by the school. Parents and guardians may prefer to shop around and purchase from alternative retailers.

Please be aware of the following criteria when choosing shoes for your daughter. Shoes worn in the school must be:

- Black or Navy
- A sensible style (i.e. no slip-on shoes)
- Flat or with a small heel which does not exceed 2.5cm or 1 inch in height
- High wedges, platforms or stiletto heels are not permitted.

- Marist Prep Pullover – royal blue with crest
- Gold blouse with reverse collar – long sleeve or short sleeve
- Socks – navy knee length or navy tights (any)
- Shoes – black/navy (any)
- Scarf

Summer Uniform

- Marist Prep Summer boater (Not compulsory for Year 6)
- Marist Prep Summer dress.
- Marist Prep French Navy Cardigan or Marist Prep Pullover
- Marist Prep Blazer – royal blue with crest
- Socks – white ankle/knee length (any)
- Black or Navy Shoes. Sandals may also be worn (not open toe) – dark blue (any)

- Marist Sports Bag – navy drawstring Linen PE Bag or Senior Sports kit bag

- Marist Prep kagoul – royal blue/navy with crest
- Wellington boots (any)
- Waterproof trousers – navy (optional)

- Hair accessories – should be blue with winter uniform and blue or white with summer uniform (any)

Directions to store

From London/East: M4 Junction 5, follow B470 to Datchet and Eton. Turn right in Datchet and continue through the village towards Slough. Turn left at the next mini-roundabout and follow the road to the T-junction (mini-roundabout), turn left to Eton.

From Reading/West: M4 Junction 6 (signposted A332 Windsor and Eton). At the roundabout, take the first exit to Slough and Eton. At the next roundabout, take the third exit to Eton, continue straight through two sets of traffic lights and turn right at the third set to Eton and Windsor. Follow the signs for Eton.

From South of the River Thames (e.g. Bracknell, Ascot, Camberley, Bagshot): Follow the signs for Windsor. Routes from M3, A30 and A332 converge on Windsor. On entering Windsor, follow the signs to Slough, Eton, M4. These lead to the major roundabout at the south end of the Windsor Relief Road (A332). Leave the Relief Road at the slip road signposted A332 Slough Town centre and Eton. At the roundabout, take the second exit to Eton.

From Maidenhead: Follow A308 to Windsor and follow the route above from the Windsor Relief Road.

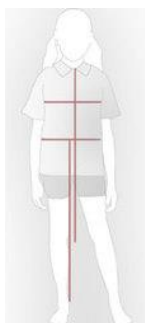
From Staines and Egham: Follow A308 past Runnymede and through Old Windsor. Follow the signs for Datchet B3021. Take the second right hand turn signed Datchet and Slough. After the level crossing, turn left towards Slough, then 300 metres on, turn left to Eton at the mini-roundabout.

Billings & Edmonds Measurement Guide

Choosing School Clothes

- Measure your child before you place your order. Please use the measuring chart below.
- Our products are sized in Imperial Measurements.
- Unless otherwise stated our sizes refer to neck (boys shirts), chest (other tops & blazers) and waist (skirts & trousers) measurements in inches.
- Allow for growth - when you're buying shirts, make sure you can fit two fingers inside the fastened collar.
- Buy 3 - 5 blouses or shirts, depending on how often you do the washing during the week.
- Order name tapes well in advance (these can often take around 2 weeks to arrive) so you'll have time to sew them on before the beginning of Term.
- Purchase your uniform as early as you can, especially if you need clothes to be altered or made to order.
- Ask for advice. Our expert staff will be happy to talk to you about a child's individual needs.

Measuring Chart



Collar

Measure around base of neck, inserting two fingers between neck and tape to allow growth.

Chest

Position tape close to underarms, measure chest at fullest point.

Dress and tunic length

Measure from nape of neck to length required.

Waist

Measure around the natural waistline.

Skirt length

Measure from middle of waist to length required.

Inside leg

Measure with shoes on, to approximately 5cm above the ground.

Uniform Rules

The governors and staff of the school consider personal appearance of the greatest importance at all times. Every girl is expected to be in full uniform, both at school and on their way to and from school. It is the responsibility of all parents to ensure that their daughters arrive in school in accordance with the stated uniform regulations. All uniform must be clearly labelled with your daughter's name.

- Girls are required to arrive in and depart from school in the correct uniform.
 - For Preparatory pupils, this includes a blazer (summer) or school coat (winter)
 - For Senior pupils, this includes a blazer (winter and spring)
- The appropriate uniform items must be worn for physical education, art and science lessons.
 - In Preparatory, overalls should be worn in the Dining Room.
- Hair must be tied back if shoulder length or longer at all times for safety and hygiene reasons.
 - In Preparatory, all hair accessories must be blue in colour and discreet. White may be worn with summer uniform.
 - In Senior, all hair accessories can be either black or navy.
- Jewellery including bangles and leather bracelets are not permitted, except a small cross and chain and plain stud earrings (if ears already pierced).
 - In Senior, a simple signet ring may also be worn.
- For health and safety reason, pierced ears are discouraged in Preparatory. Strict guidelines are in place for older girls which require piercing in the summer to allow healing time prior to the start of term, as it is essential that girls remove earrings for all physical activities.
- Hair dye or colouring is prohibited and no extensions are permitted.
- Nail vanish and false nails are not permitted.
- Skirt/dress length should not exceed 5cms (2 inches) above the crease behind the knee

Lost Property

- The primary responsibility for personal property lies with the individual girls in the first instance
- The school requires that all personal property is clearly named, engraved or permanently marked. We recommend that name tapes are sewn on to items of clothing as marker pens fade with washing.
 - At Preparatory, lost property is kept in a unit outside the hall, where it is sorted at the end of each half term. Any unnamed uniform will go to the Thrift Shop; all other items will be given to charitable organisations.
 - At Senior, lost property is taken to the School Office, where it is sorted at the end of each half term. Any un-named uniform will go to the Recycled Uniform Shop; all other items will be given to charitable organisations.

- In Senior, girls are issued with lockers and it is their responsibility to ensure that they are securely locked.

Second Hand Uniform Shops

If you would like to sell any unwanted uniform items then we run a Thrift Shop (Preparatory) and a Recycled Uniform Shop (Senior) in school.

Donating items to the Thrift Shop (Preparatory)

When delivering uniform for the Thrift Shop, please drop off any items directly to the School Office.

Donating items to the Recycled Uniform Shop (Senior)

Please ensure that any items are delivered to the School Office labelled with your daughter's name and form and your name, address and telephone number.

We will take clothes on a basis of 50/50 – half the proceeds going to the school fund and half to you. The clothes will be priced at approximately half their retail price unless in exceptional condition.

Years 7 to 11

Winter Uniform

- Marist Gold blouse
- Marist Senior V-neck navy school jumper

All the above are available from Billings & Edmonds unless stated as 'any' or 'any brand'

Shoe Guidelines – The school recommends the current range from Johnsons/Bowley Shoes (a flyer is included in the starter pack) but parents are free to choose from other high street brands using the following guidelines.

Shoes worn in the school should be:

- Black
- A sensible style
- Flat or with a small heel which does not exceed 5cm or 2 inches in height
- Appropriate for wet weather
- Provide support for feet
- High wedges, heavy platforms, kitten or stiletto heels are not permitted

- Athletics shorts (optional) - available from PE staff in school
- Marist Navy Blue Skort
- Marist Senior Coloured House T-shirt
 - Champion – Red
 - Chanel – Green

Sixth Form Uniform Checklist

Number One Uniform

For special occasions such as Prize Giving, Open Mornings, Concerts etc. Students will be expected to wear the following:

- Plain tailored black skirt suit (matching fabric not jersey fabric)
- White collared blouse – several styles are available including revere collars from Billings and Edmonds
- Plain black shoes

Number Two Uniform

For general wear:

- Plain tailored trouser or skirt suit in black
- No jeans or low-slung hipsters or tube skirts
- Tailored coloured blouse with collar and full buttons
- No “layering” t-shirts, polo shirts or vest tops
- Jumpers and cardigans – navy or black – no logos
- Coats, jackets or fleeces – navy or black – no logos or hoodies
- Shoes – black. No ballerina pumps, gym shoes, trainers or excessively high heels
- Tights – flesh coloured or black plain socks
- Jewellery – discreet and business-like
- Make-up – discreet and business-like
- Hair – well groomed. No extremes of fashion
- Skirt/dress length should not exceed 5cms (2 inches) above the crease behind the knee

As a general guideline, jackets should be worn when students leave the Sixth Form area and walk about the school. If necessary, jackets can be removed when students have reached your destination.

Additional Requirements

(Senior Pupils)

General Requirements

- Pencil case/box or container
- Pens (variety) black/blue
- Pencils HB and H
- Ruler (30cm)
- Rubber (no ink erasers)
- Set of small colouring pencils
- Glue stick
- Small scissors

Each girl is provided with a starter pack which includes a planner, books, files, calculator, sketch book, pen drive and a Bible

Subject Requirements

- White Craft Apron – available from Billings & Edmonds (without this pupils will not be allowed to cook).

- Semi-circular protractor
- Pair of compasses (preferably the style where a small pencil is inserted)

- Tape measure marked in cm
- Coloured threads are useful
- Unpicker
