Archaeology Society Capacity: 25	Day: Wednesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 1 <sup>st</sup> - 3 <sup>rd</sup> , but older pupils may attend if this wish to help run the society Staff: SCF	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
Archaeology is the study of physical remains of the past in pursuit of an understanding of human culture. Join the Archaeology Society as we look at different world cultures including the Ancient Egyptians, Assyrians and Greeks as well as the million-year-old fossilised remains of our earliest human ancestors in Africa and the scientific methods of analysis used in archaeology. There will be an opportunity to work with the University of Cambridge Division of Archaeology.

This club is for those who are curious about Art. We will look at examples of Art from different times. We will find out why they were done and try making some of the things we find. Past projects have included Cave paintings, Pop Art prints, a mosaic and Egyptian hieroglyphics.

This is intended to extend the development of GCSE and A Level Artists into new areas with their practical work. This may be through the use of different media or by making coursework more sophisticated and adventurous.

The intention of this activity is for pupils to be able to come along and make some guided observations of the night sky. In the weeks where direct observation is not possible, we will plan our observations for the following weeks. This may mean that the day on which the club runs changes to coincide with significant celestial events.

By invite only; a Gifted, Talented and Able club which explores Literature as an art form across the ages. International and National Literature Prize winners and nominations will be discussed and pupils will be exposed to a range of Literature in preparation for Russell Group and Oxbridge applications.			

Biology Discussion Group and Supra-Molecular Chemistry (alternating on week by week basis) Capacity: 16	Day: Wednesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 4 <sup>th</sup> & 5 <sup>th</sup> Form by invitation, 6 <sup>th</sup> Staff: SJM/AJS	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
<p>This provides an opportunity to discuss scientific topics that appear in the news or research papers. Past meetings have covered the intelligence of ants, where influenza pandemics come from and how our brains measure and record the passage of time. The subjects run on a fortnightly basis.</p> <p>In Supra-Molecular Chemistry sessions selected topics from undergraduate Chemistry/Physics courses will be discussed. The topics are advanced and will require regular attendance to get maximum benefit. We will explore why reactions happen at a fundamental level and will introduce some quantum mechanics to be able to explain the ideas.</p>			
Book Club Capacity: 8	Day: Wednesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 1 <sup>st</sup> – 3 <sup>rd</sup> Staff: KAT	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
<p>Pupils have the opportunity to read a range of literature for pleasure. The group discuss how stories are constructed and how different authors create believable worlds and characters. Ideal for those that enjoy reading and want to expand their knowledge of classic stories.</p>			
Coding Challenge Club Capacity: 10	Day: Thursday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 3 <sup>rd</sup> – 6 <sup>th</sup> Staff: MJA	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
<p>The group will target challenges and competitions for computer programmers. Coding aptitude would be a benefit but is not essential; you do need to enjoy solving complex problems.</p> <p>If you are part of the Electronics or Robotics clubs, this club may be a useful addition.</p>			
Coding for Games Club Capacity: 12	Day: Tuesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 2 <sup>nd</sup> - 5 <sup>th</sup> Staff: MA	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
<p>This is a session that will focus on producing code for fun purposes – we will use predominantly Scratch and Python to create patterns, simple but playable games and useful apps. You will learn additional programming techniques to those developed in Computer Science lessons - be aware that whilst the outcomes may be fun, there will be much thought and effort going into making them; sign up is for those who enjoy the process as much as the outcome.</p>			
CREST Capacity: 30	Day: Monday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 3 <sup>rd</sup> -5 <sup>th</sup> Staff: JL/GSP/DCC/ AJS	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
<p>CREST is a national award scheme that recognises success, and enables pupils to build their skills and demonstrate personal achievement through the completion of a scientific investigation. Pupils have the opportunity take ownership of their projects and choose to undertake them in areas they enjoy, whilst enriching their scientific knowledge and developing scientific inquiry skills. Pupils are able to complete Bronze, Silver or Gold level awards.</p>			
Dead Playwright's Society Capacity: 10	Day: Thursday Time: Period 5	Age Group: All Staff: AMC/SED	Michaelmas
<p>A practical opportunity to expand your knowledge of the History of Theatre by working on extracts of classic play texts.</p>			
Design Technology Capacity: Monday 20, Wednesday 15	Days: Mon, Wed Times: Period 5	Age Group: All Staff: RDF (and MAJ Monday)	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
<p>The workshop is open to pupils who will be able to pursue projects.</p>			

Economics for Beginners Capacity: 20	Day: Thursday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 4 <sup>th</sup> - 6 <sup>th</sup> Staff: VG	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
<p>These sessions are to explore economics in the world and will investigate personal economic issues, and “new” economics. Who knew there was something called “meateconomics” for example?</p> <p>Ideal for anyone who wants something different, or anyone considering Economics in the future.</p>			
Electronics Club Capacity: 10	Day: Wednesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 1 <sup>st</sup> - 5 <sup>th</sup> Staff: CIC/CT	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
<p>Electronics Club gives practical advice to enable pupils to build working projects of their own. New pupils start with soldering, creating simple LED lights. Further projects, using pins and matrix boards, allow pupils to follow circuit diagrams and build completed models that closely resemble the paper designs. Once the required skills are learnt, pupils may assemble their own choice of circuits. Additionally we have a set of Arduino programmable boards which enable pupils to control their circuits by writing computer code. We will also be introducing control of motors and servos to create simple robots. This club is great for those interested in electronics, computer programming or engineering.</p>

<p>Help and advice with English work, essays, set texts, spelling and grammar. Sixth form A Level students also offer advice.</p>

<p>Enrichment activity involving aspiring A level and GCSE Geography pupils. Each week a topic is investigated with support material provided and encouragement for pupils to research independently events in the news and/or related to A level curriculum topics.</p>			
Geo Engineers Capacity: 15	Day: Wednesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: All Staff: RDK/MAJ	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
<p>Solve a range of Geographical Issues by creating Engineering Solutions. Follow a process of researching the problem, then identifying a solution then designing and constructing models to test.</p> <p>For example – how can buildings be made earthquake proof? How effective are different river flood defences? Understanding Tsunami Waves, Managing movement of sediment along coasts.</p>			
Geography Help Capacity: 20	Day: Tuesday Time: 16.20-17.30	Age Group: All Staff: RDK	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
<p>Academic support; help for any pupil who require support with homework tasks or additional one-to-one help with classroom tasks. In the Lent and Trinity Terms this session also incorporates Revision for A Level pupils.</p>			

History Club Capacity: 20	Day: Wednesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 1 <sup>st</sup> – 3 <sup>rd</sup> Staff: SE	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
This is a club for all those interested in History. You will have the opportunity to investigate periods of History not examined in class. The club will have practical and fun activities such as building models, making displays, producing videos, etc.			
History/Politics Academic Support Capacity: 20	Day: Tuesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: All Staff: SE/TDC/KJM	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
This session provides focussed help and support to all pupils studying History or Politics. For GCSE and A Level students. This will be a great opportunity for further reading, revision or guidance on exam technique.			
Homework Club	Day: Daily Time: 16.20 – 17.30	Age Group: All Staff: Teaching Staff	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
Homework Club runs every evening and is open to all Senior School pupils. It is supervised by a member of the Senior School teaching staff.

An opportunity for all year groups to catch up on homework using the ICT lab's facilities. Room 56, lunchtimes (12.30-1:15) and after school (4.30 – 5.30).

Use your knowledge of languages to discuss news and general topics of interest. Practising your languages with others will increase your overall confidence in using this language.			
Language Leaders Capacity: 10	Day: Wednesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 6 <sup>th</sup> Staff: NPN	Michaelmas
This club is open to all 6 <sup>th</sup> form pupils who either study a Modern Foreign Language or have a passion for languages. You will be taught the basics of teaching and planning methodology, and then asked to lead language learning activities in a primary classroom. You will also plan a language learning event for primary school pupils. This club is not only for people who are thinking of going into teaching, but if you are, it will provide you with a lot of skills which you can use later on in your career.			

Language Ambassadors Capacity: 15	Day: Wednesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 2 <sup>nd</sup> – 4 <sup>th</sup> Staff: NPN	Lent
Are you interested in teaching or working with children? This club will teach you the basics of planning a language learning activity and how to help children learn French, German or Spanish. You don't need to be really good at languages, you only need to be dedicated, a positive role model and enthusiastic about languages. It will help you develop leadership skills but will also help with your own language learning. Once you have been trained, you will be able to lead some activities with our Prep School pupils.			
Library	Day: Daily Time: Lunchtime	Age Group: All Staff: Various	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
The Library is open to all pupils and staff. Staff are on hand to advise on reading and suggest suitable books to use for homework. 5 computers are available for pupil use, with a computerised catalogue of reading material. New stock is added to the library annually, including up to date fiction for 11-16 year olds and research books which support the curriculum. Pupils can borrow up to 4 books at a time for up to 3 weeks.			
Maths Help Capacity: 15	Day: Mon/Thurs Time: Period 5	Age Group: All Staff: CT (Mon)/GEH (Thurs)	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
This club is for any pupils wishing to gain extra maths support. Please come along with your books and your work and you will receive help from Mr Howes and Thursby.			
Maths Challenge Capacity: 20	Day: Tuesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: All Staff: GEH	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
Maths Challenge - Go for Gold – this club aims to teach you and guide you to top scores on the Maths Challenge competitions which are so highly regarded by universities			
Exploring Psychology Capacity: 12	Day: Monday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 3 <sup>rd</sup> - 5 <sup>th</sup> Staff: JMG/JL	Trinity
An opportunity for pupils new to psychology to explore the subject. We will be watching interesting clips from famous psychology studies, documentaries, films and TED talks. Looking at and explaining the behaviour of people in the news and on television. We will discuss and debate interesting experiments, mental health, why people and animals may behave the way they do. This group will allow pupils to have the freedom to explore topics that they are interested in and may not have had the opportunity to discuss in lessons before, it will also allow pupils to gain a better understanding of psychology and help prepare/enthuse them for A level studies.			
Numeracy Club Capacity: 10	Day: Wednesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: All Staff: VH	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
Pupils are offered the opportunity to improve their numeracy skills by working on some basic numerical tasks such as multiplication tables, number bonds etc. The aim is to build the pupils' confidence in maths by working through lots of simple numerical problems, and getting plenty of practice. We also encourage pupils to explore different strategies to help them solve questions.

Pupils will look at philosophical ideas concerning ethics, philosophy of mind and epistemology.

This is a chance for GCSE pupils to learn about how the UK works – its government, the current issues and some of the ideas / arguments behind what is happening in the news. If you have any interest in current affairs, this is ideal; each week, a different topic is looked at – such as feminism, the role of the Prime Minister, corruption in sport, the EU and Brexit, environmental risks, political parties and propaganda, veganism and Trump's USA.			
Psychology Clinic Capacity: 12	Day: Tuesday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 5 <sup>th</sup> - 6 <sup>th</sup> Staff: JMG/JL	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
Academic support for 5 <sup>th</sup> and 6 <sup>th</sup> form psychology pupils.			
Robotics Capacity: 10	Day: Tuesday Time: 16.20 - 17.30	Age Group: 6 <sup>th</sup> Staff: CIC	Michaelmas Lent
The primary aim of this club is for pupils to design, manufacture and program an autonomous robot to compete in Student Robotics, a national competition involving over 50 schools. As such this club will test design and engineering skills as well as enhancing the knowledge of different mechanisms. For those who are more interested in software design, the club provides a great platform to learn new programming skills to overcome real life problems. Prior knowledge of computer programming is not required as the basics can be picked up very quickly.			
Science Hospital (Complete Treatment!) Building Biology, Curing Chemistry and Fixing Physics Capacity: 40	Day: Thursday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 5th-6th Staff: AJS, CIC, GSP, DCC, JLL	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
Pupils are offered the opportunity to seek guidance and support with their work. A member of staff is available to offer advice with completion of assignments or projects.			
Language Discussion Capacity: 15	Day: Monday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 4th-6th Staff: NPN/IR/MMS/ Language Assistant	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
Use your knowledge of languages to discuss news and general topics of interest. Practising your languages with others will increase your overall confidence in using this language.			
Spanish Club Capacity: 15	Day: Monday Time: Period 5	Age Group: 3 <sup>rd</sup> - 4 <sup>th</sup> Staff: IR /TPJ	Michaelmas Lent Trinity
This aim is to boost achievement in Spanish for pupils who are just at the start of their learning and wish to take Spanish up to GCSE. If pupils have been unable to fit three languages in their GCSE options, this could help them maintain a good level. This club will be very academic and it is envisaged that it will lead to gaining a recognised qualification.

The School offers all 3 levels: Bronze for those pupils in the Third form, Silver for those in the Fourth form and Gold for those over 16.

Planning and administration of each award will take place during the school day, but will require some updating at home, via the eDofE system

Expedition training will also take place during the school day and on occasional Saturday mornings. Each participant is required to attend the route planning and training sessions plus spend some of their spare time completing the Service, Skills and Physical sections of their award.
